LOST.—Andrew Droh, a miner belonging to Mt. Carmel, where he has a wife and child, left Centuria on Saturday evening last for home, somewhat intoxicated. It is thought he may have fallen into one of the many deep pits on the mountain—the cave-ins of old mines.

BURNED TO DEATH.—On Monday of last week, a two year old child of MINOR WYNN, of Lower Augusta township, Northumberland county, was burned to death through the absence of its mother. The innocent little victim was playing with the fire when the sad occurrence took place.

THE Shamokin Herald of the 19th inst., says: "But little is being done at present in mining coal in our county. Only four operations are running now (the Cameron, Burnside, Bear Valley, and Frank Gowen), and great efforts are being made to have them suspended. The result will be no more than we can predict.

DANVILLE, HAZLETON & WILKES-BARRE RAILROAD.—At a meeting of the stockholders of the Danville, Hazleton and Wilkes-Barre Railroad Company, R. I. Dodd was elected President, Directors—S. P. Case, of Danville; R. B. Wolverson, of Sunbury; H. W. McReynolds, of Buck Horn; A. F. Porter, of Norristown; J. H. Case, of Danville.

THE extension of the Catawissa Railroad passes through an old fort, on land belonging to ANDREW EVES, not far from the mouth of Muncy Creek. In excavating through it, quite a number of small stone fire-places, Indian pottery, and stone tools, suppose to have been used in making it, were unearthed. Curiosity seekers have been busy in gathering everything in the shape of Indian relics that have been turned up by the plow and scraper.

THE Special Business meeting of the Y. M. C. A., which was held in their rooms on Thursday evening of last week, was of more than usual interest. It was called for the purpose of effecting a more thorough and efficient organization than has hitherto existed. Col. KNOX was called to the Chair and conducted the session. Theological exercises, after which a Committee, appointed at a previous meeting, reported a form of Constitution for the Association. MURDER AT TREVORTON.—A minor named JOHN BALKEMAN, was shot on Saturday night last at Trevorton, sitting by the bedside of a sick neighbor, from the effects of which he died on Sunday. The murderer fired through the window. The weapon was loaded with buckshot, one of which took effect in BALKEMAN'S head. It is said that he was working in a colliery operated on the independent plan, and the inference is drawn that he was murdered in consequence.—Potterville Standard.

ATTEMPTED MURDER OF JOHN TONK, BURGES OF SHERMAN.—We copy the following particulars on the attempt upon the life of Mr. TONK, on Sunday morning last, from the Shenandoah Herald.

"Mr. TONK lives in Centre street, near the Lehigh Valley railroad depot, and while he is agent for the brewers of Potterville, he also carries on a bottling establishment. As Chief Burgess he has made himself particularly obnoxious to the bad characters in our town, by his prompt and efficient performance of his duty. He was elected Burgess at the last election without opposition, both parties voting for him.

At one o'clock Sunday morning, after his place was locked up, there was a knock at the door. Young TONK opened it after finding out who was outside, to admit JOHN HURLEY who wanted half a dozen bottles of Cronk beer. Mr. TONK supplied him and lit him to the door from which a pair of steps leads to the pavement; while fighting him down the steps, and when HURLEY was part way down, a shot was fired at Mr. TONK from the street, and he fell. He was shot in the arm, and his gun caught him in his arms, and while holding him recognized JOHN O'BRYEN in the street about twenty feet off, who said, "Come on, that is the last of him." Mr. TONK is badly shot about the face, shoulder and breast, the gun having been loaded with No. 6 shot, buckshot and pieces of bullets. Drs. KEARN and BEGAN were immediately called to attend him. He is expected to recover.

O'BRYEN was arrested on Sunday morning in MARTIN'S cellar, on Centre street, with a gun in his possession, by Constable EDWARD MONAGHAN. He had a hearing at once before Squire WILLIAMS, who committed him, and he was taken to jail, at Potterville, the same day. O'BRYEN is a young man, about 25 years of age, light built, is about 5 feet 6 inches in height and has light hair and eyes. About two weeks before Christmas he came out of jail, having been sentenced some time since to four months imprisonment for striking Constable JOSEPH BOHRM, and it is supposed he tried to murder Mr. TONK out of revenge for the active part he took in having him arrested for that affair."
