### Hypocrisy.

We have never been enthusiastic believers in the honesty of the desire for reform as set forth in Republican newspapers or proclaimed by the orators of that party, because the actions of the party were totally at variance with their expressed opinions. To expose fraud when committed by those differing from you politically, is perhaps deserving of little commendation, but to uphold abuses and defend scoundrels who may happen to vote with you, is to do that which is worthy of the scorn ate. and contempt of all true men.
