The Laws of SHIPPING SHIPWRECKS.—In McLaughlin vs. The City of Cory, 7 Leg. Int. 12, the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania held that a municipal corporation is responsible for injuries to a first passenger caused by dangerous accumulation of ice and snow on the sidewalk. The principle laid down in the case is this: "A municipality cannot prevent the general slipperiness of its streets caused by the snow in it during the winter; but it can prevent such accumulations of ice, in the shape of ridges and hills, as render the passage dangerous."
