We have begun a series of articles on the industries and business houses of this town and county, and shall from time to time give brief sketches of the men and their several enterprises which have helped to make Bloomsburg what it is. Among these is our respected townsmen David Lowenberg, Merchant Tailor, and dealer in ready made clothing. Goods furnishing good, and all articles usually found in such an establishment.

David Lowenberg is a Bavarian by birth and left his native country during the great political struggle of 1848-'9. In 1850 he came to Bloomsburg and in the spring of 1851 went into the clothing business in one little frame building on Main street above the Court House, which he occupied until June 1st 1871.
