This is made necessary in order that the Prothonotary may be enabled to notify the Secretary of State, and prevent delay in receiving commissions, as in no case will notice of election be given until this information is received.

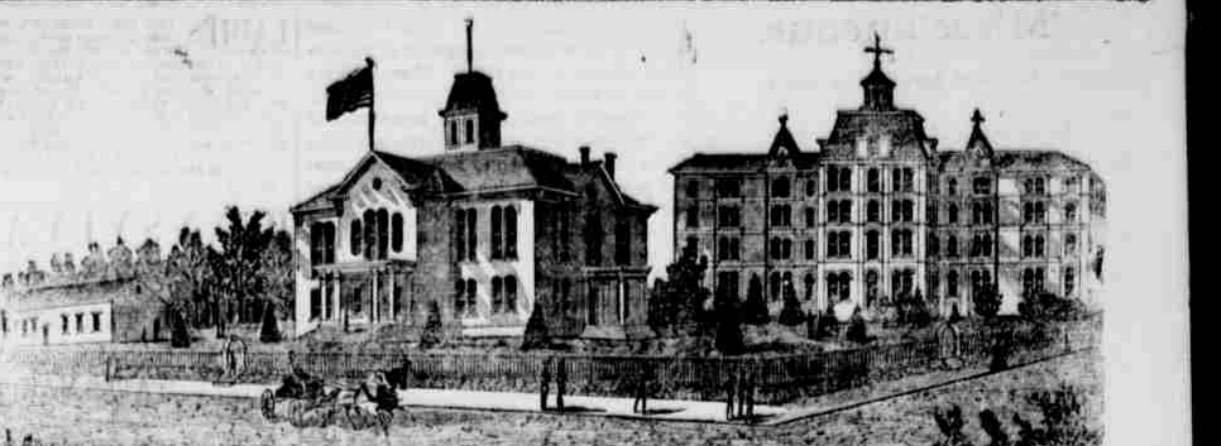
