LAW FOR DEUGOISTS .- Judge Dean, at a recent term of the Blair county court, in sentencing the Tyrone druggist for selling liquor with out license, took occasion to remark substan tially as follows:

"Druggists are authorized to sell liquor for medical purposes, subject, however, to indict-ment. A physician's prescription is not of itself a sufeguard for the druggist. If the latter, even on the prescription of a regular physician, self-liquor to persons of known intemperate habits or to those who are known to use liquor as a beverage, he is liable to indictment, and it found guilty will be punished to the extent of the law. In short, in the opinion of the court, a druggist who selfs liquor for any purpose whatever, or upon the prescription of the most eminent physician in the county, does so at their own rick." a safeguard for the druggist.
