The recent discussion of Count Ferdinar de Lessep's interoceanie canal project recall to my mind an ancodote of Gen. Mirsbeau B. Lamar, the Texan patrice, which you may decin worth printing. I may here remark that Gen. Lamar was one of the Tex an leaders when that State declared its independence of Mexico.
