Dr. Tanner completed his forty days fast at noon last Saturday. At 7 o'clock in the morning he had a fit of vomiting.

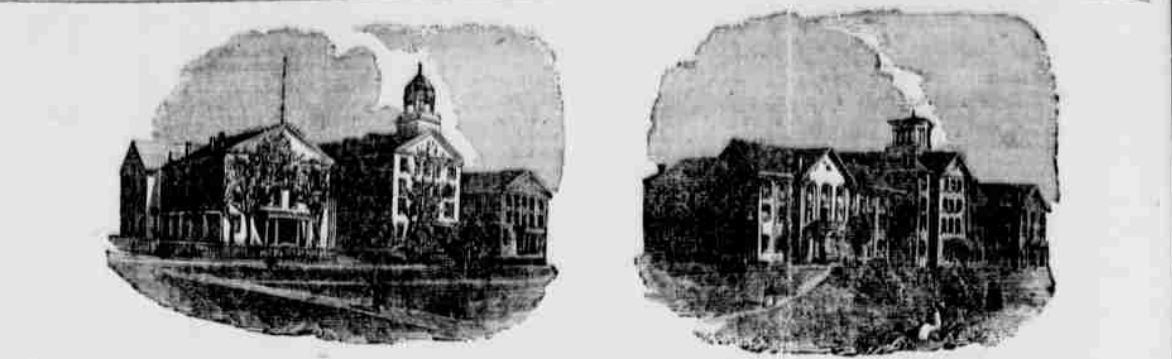
