SOME ITEMS FROM THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

The general appropriation bill has now passed the House finally and will be considered in the Senate...

HAWKING AND PEDDLING.

The following opinion of the court, filed March 26th, 1881, in the case of the Commonwealth vs. John Hughes...

The Court.

The first count in the indictment charges that the defendant did unlawfully sell, as a hawker and pedler, foreign and domestic goods, wares and merchandise...

The verdict of the jury finds that the Act of Assembly passed April 7, 1846, Pamphlet Laws 1846, page 364, was passed to Columbia county, by Act passed 27 March 1848, Pamphlet Laws 1848, page 270, and that same is now in force in this county.

The second count charges that he did unlawfully expose to sale as a hawker and pedler, foreign and domestic goods, wares and merchandise...

The words "hawker" and "pedler," as employed in statutes are nearly synonymous, identical in meaning and each of them is defined by a warrant from the sheriff of Columbia county...

The word "goods," in its largest sense signifies all a man's property other than real estate...

The Act of Assembly makes no exception in regard to articles of food or any other class of goods...

Upon the facts found by the verdict, we are of opinion that the defendant was guilty of the offense charged in the indictment...

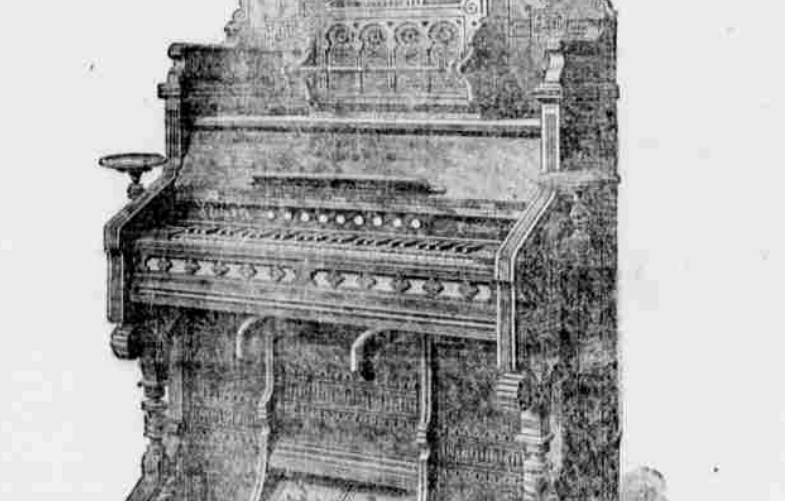
