News Items.

Engineer Melville has telegraphed to the American Legation at St. Petersburg that the Jeanette was surrounded and crushed by ice on the 23d of June, at latitude 77 north, and longitude 157 east. The crew left the vessel in three boats. About fifty miles from the mouth of the Lena they were separated by violent winds and thick fogs. Boat No. 3, commanded by Engineer Melville, arrived on the 29th of September at the eastern mouth of the river Lena, where it was stopped by blocks of ice, near the village of Bolengena, inhabited by idolaters. Boat No. 1 reached the same spot. The occupants of these boats state that Lieutenant DeLong and Dr. Ambler, with twelve others, landed at the northern mouth of the Lena, and are in a fearful condition, suffering from frost bitten limbs. A party of the inhabitants of Bolengena started immediately for their assistance. Nothing is known of Boat No. 2.

Mr. John W. Garrett has been re-elected president of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad for the twenty-fourth time.

Terrible Accident.—Last Saturday afternoon, about 3 o'clock, the still in E. J. Beyer's distillery exploded.

The "lobby" broken up by Speaker Randall and a Democratic Congress is returning to Washington. Fat stallions are again expected from Republican rule in the Capitol. So much for the defeat of Hancock.

Rev. Dr. Leonard Bacon, the eminent congregational clergyman, died in New Haven on the 24th inst. aged 79 years.

Frederick Litch, the Reading brewer, has failed. His liabilities are placed at \$300,000, and assets \$250,000.

Hon. John J. Pearson, who has been on the bench in Dauphin county for the past thirty years, performed his last official act on Tuesday. It was the issuing of a decree of dissolution of the Lehigh Mutual Aid Association of Harrisburg.

The president was also ordered to procure a charter for the association.

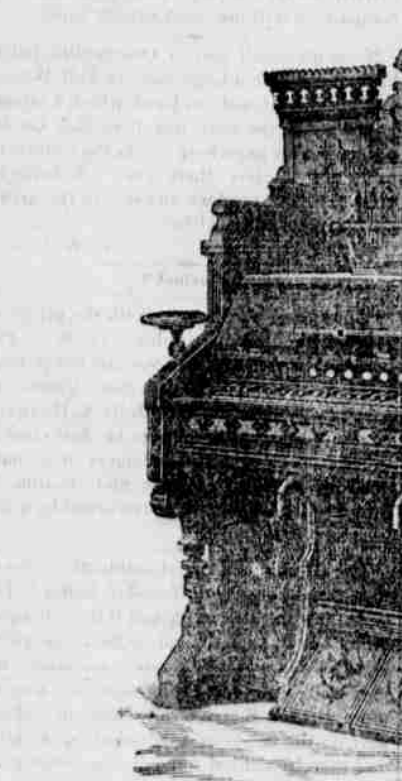
