#### The Real Republican Battle.

The battle on part of the Republifor the election of General Beaver, for that is impossible but in the feaver, that is impossible; but it is a battle for numerical superiority on the side of the Republican Bosses or on the side of the Republican people. All the pro-claimed confidence of the machine leaders in the election of General Beaver is simply a shallow pretense to re-duce Stewart's vote below that cast for Beaver. They know that Beaver must be tens of thousands short of an election under the most favorable circumstances, and the Cameron Bosses are now battling desperately to secure a majority of the Republican vote and thus be able to maintain their claim to the future control of the party organi-zation. It is possible that Geneal Bea-ver believes in his own election. He says so in all his speeches, and one of his timited experience in political cam-paigns, meeting only flatterers and re-ceiving the ovations of his party, may be pardoned for the delusion that he is within reach of success; but outside of Beaver, there is not one of the machine leaders who doesn't know that the entire Cameron ticket is now hopelessly beaten. They now have only one ob-jective point in the campaign, and that is to poll more votes for Beaver than the Independents can poll for Stewart ; and they know that Stewart would largely lead Beaver if the Republican people of the State regarded Beaver's election as utterly hopeless. They count on holding from fifty to one hundred thousand Republicans to Beaver solely because there may be a possibility of Beaver's election, as many would reluctantly vote for Beaver as a choice between Beaver and a Demo-

crat. The Cameron machine could have had a Republican Governor by accept-ing Senator Stewart; but they have declined to have any Republican vic-tory unless it shall be a Cameron victory. Cameron, Beaver and all the zealous supporters of the machine system, don't conceal their preference for Pattison over Stewart, and if Cameron and Beaver can't win, they mean that Pattison shall be the next Governor. In short, the one obstacle to Republi-can success in Pennsylvania is the Cameron Boss system and its State ticket, and it is now as certain as the rising of the sun on election day, that Benver will be beaten largely. The Bosses obstinately refuse to have a purer and better Republican authority, preferring a Democratic Governor and Democratic control of the State to an honest Republican victory, and the single issue that remains for Republicans to battle for is the supremacy of Boss

or Independent rule in the party. The certainty of machine defeat absolves every Republican from all considerations of party expediency in casting his vote, and all can freely vote their own sincere convictions. If that shall be done, Stewart's vote will greatly exceed the machine vote for Beaver, and the Republican organiza-tion will thus be transferred to the honest and fearless men who are now bat-tling for Republican integrity and man-hood. A Boss victory is no longer possible in Pennsylvania, but a substan tial triumph for an elevated and purified Republicanism can be achieved by polling two hundred thousand or more votes for John Stewart .- Philadelphia


