On motion of Col. T. W. Higginson, the following resolution was passed: Resolved, That the foregoing committee be instructed to call a meeting in Boston as early as possible to express the opinion of independent voters in this vicinity in regard to the Chicago nominations, and to prepare for future action.

Telegrams were received from leading New York independents requesting an early consultation on decisive action toward repudiating the Chicago nomination, and looking to such further steps as may be deemed necessary.

THE REPUBLICAN TICKET. BLAINE AND LOGAN NOMINATED.

The National Republican Convention completed its labors last Friday by the nomination of James G. Blaine of Maine for President, and John A. Logan of Illinois for Vice-President.

Blaine was chosen on the 4th ballot, receiving 544 votes, only 410 being necessary to a choice.
