NOTICE. The members of the Standing Committee of the Democratic party of the county of Columbia, will meet at the office of the Chairman on Tuesday the 27th day of May, inst. at 10 o'clock A. M. for the purpose of electing four persons as delegates to the State Convention which convenes at Scranton, July 2, 1890.

Warren county is the home of Mr. Delamater. On Saturday last at the republican primary elections C. W. Stone captured the county, and secured the delegates to the state convention.

Ex-Mayor Richard Vaux has been nominated by the democratic convention of the Third district of Philadelphia, as a candidate for Congress to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Samuel J. Handall. The special election will be held on May 20. There were a number of other candidates but all stepped out of the way for Mr. Vaux and he was unanimously nominated.

As yet there is no announcement of any candidate for representative on this side of the river. The name of Peter A. Evans of Moutour township is being talked of, and his many friends are urging him to be a candidate. He is an intelligent man, and as he is a farmer he knows the needs of the farmers.

State Senator. C. Lane Manson Esq. of Lycoming, B. S. Collins Esq. of Sullivan and probably Dr. Hoffa of Moutour will be the candidates for the office of State Senator for this district from the county. The names of Grant Herrick and A. L. Fritz are used as probable contestants for the nomination in this county.

Court Proceedings. Com. vs Charles E. Smith, plea of not guilty on first count, guilty on second count. Sentenced to pay costs, fine of \$10 and \$20 lying in expenses, \$15 funeral expenses.

Commonwealth vs. Mrs. Forney, keeping a bawdy house, true bill. Alvin Moser vs. Flora Moser, divorce decreed.

Commonwealth vs. Samuel A. Smith, on motion of District attorney not pro allowed. Commonwealth vs. Nell Stroup, keeping a bawdy house, true bill, continued to next session.

Commonwealth vs. William Teeple, continued. Commonwealth vs. John Roadman, true bill, not pro ordered on payment of costs.

Commonwealth vs. M. B. Eddy, assault and battery, case tried, verdict guilty. Commonwealth vs. William Highmiller, larceny, recognition forfeited to be repaid on appearance at next session.

Commonwealth vs. Lotta Manhart, true bill. Commonwealth vs. Felix Ritter, not a true bill. The following roads were confirmed absolute May 6: Benton near H. Everett's store, Hemlock near M. C. Whitehead's.

Grand Jury reported in favor of a borough at Millville. Jurors were discharged on Thursday, grand jury discharged on Friday.

Docket called and judgments taken. Commonwealth vs. Joseph Gravel, defendant pleads guilty. Auditor's report in estate of Alfred Bower confirmed.

Amos Appelman was sentenced to pay a fine of \$500, and costs of prosecution and undergo an imprisonment in the Eastern Penitentiary for one year and two months. Mrs. Forney pleaded guilty on the indictment for keeping a bawdy house. She was sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and the cost of prosecution, and undergo imprisonment in the county jail for one year. Sentence for selling liquor without a license was suspended.
