No. 20.

Hot weather breeds millions of lice. Lousy chickens or turkeys cannot thrive.

Give the poultry that is confined some kind of a shade this hot weather. Also they should have fresh water given them at least twice a day and often would be better.

Try feeding wheat and oats in rotation, and note the result, it is better to feed a variety of food than to feed all of one kind.

Improve your stock by buying some pure bred fowls, or a few settings of eggs, as breeding from the same stock will degenerate your flock.
