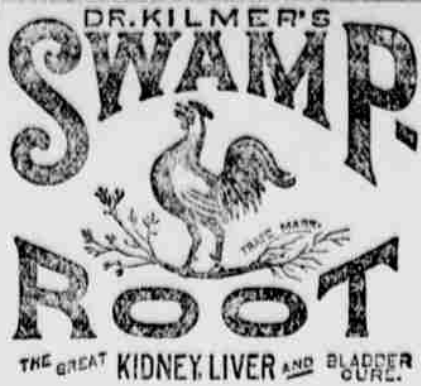

Important Laws Recommended.

Hon. E. M. Tewksbury at the opening of this session submitted the following resolutions for action by the Legislature:

WHEREAS, The Public School system of Pennsylvania, legalized by Act of Assembly, A. D. 1836, and by supplement thereto by Legislature of A. D. 1854, has been of such beneficial effect to the Commonwealth; and whereas, the Constitution of Pennsylvania, A. D. 1873-74, made it mandatory upon the Legislature to appropriate from the State Treasury at least one million dollars annually for the use of the public schools; and whereas, the Pennsylvania State Grange, P. of H., has from time to time, by resolution, asked for increased appropriation for our public schools, until at the session thereof in A. D. 1890, it asked for at least four millions of dollars, to be appropriated for public school purposes, and our most sanguine expectations were more than realized in the appropriation of five millions annually; and whereas, at our last meeting of State Grange, A. D. 1891, it was unanimously resolved to ask the Legislature of A. D. 1893 to appropriate from the State Treasury a sufficient sum to defray the entire expenses of our public schools for at least eight months in all our school districts.

Resolved, That this State Grange of A. D. 1892 reaffirm its resolution of A. D. 1890, and urges upon the Legislature about to convene the enactment into a law said resolution, and hereby pledge this State Grange to use all honorable means for the enactment of the same, and direct the Legislative Committee hereof to make that one of the objects of legislation.

Resolved, That the thanks of this State Grange are hereby tendered to the several Legislatures, who, by their acts, have given heed to our resolutions founded upon one of the fundamental principles of our Order.

Resolved, That this State Grange hereby renews its devotion to the principles of the public school law, that property of the State, the entire moneyed wealth of the State, shall educate the children of the State.

Resolved, That this State Grange instructs its Legislative Committee to labor for the enactment of a law at the next session of the Legislature of Pennsylvania prohibiting the employment of any child under 16 years of age who has not attended school at least four months of the current year, immediately preceding the employment sought, by any person or persons, corporations, under a penalty of not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each and every offense, at the discretion of the court, of the proper county in which the offense is committed; and that every such child under the age of sixteen years of age so employed shall have a certificate, signed by the President and Secretary of the proper school board where such school attendance was made, except where the attendance was at a private school the certificate shall be made by the teacher of said private school and at least one director or manager of the same, duly sworn to before a person authorized to administer oaths in this Commonwealth.

Referred to committee on Resolutions.

WHEREAS, This State Grange from time to time has by resolution and otherwise declared most emphatically in favor of a just and equal distribution of the burdens of the State and has called loudly for the enactment of a law by our Legislature equalizing the burdens of taxation; and whereas, we have session after session of the Legislature been disappointed in having in any very great degree the burdens lifted from their homes, either in country or town, by the passage of a law by which the corporate wealth of the State should bear its equal share of the expenses of the State, county and township administration of affairs, therefore,

Resolved, That this State Grange again instruct its Legislative Committee to labor for the enactment of a law at the coming session of the Legislature regulating the assessment and collecting of the revenues necessary to defray the expenses of the State in all

its departments in such a way that every species of moneyed wealth shall bear its equal share and no more, of the burdens of society.

Resolved, That we as farmers and home owners hereby declare our disfavor to all class legislation, and ask for no favors we are not willing to give to any and all other species of wealth, and only ask for the enactment of laws putting all upon one common platform.

Referred to Committee on Resolutions.

WHEREAS, The game laws of this Commonwealth are in a crude and unsatisfactory state, so that hunters are allowed to kill game at almost any time of the year, thus enabling them to kill game out of season, without possibility of detection; therefore,

Resolved, That we, as a State Grange, are in favor of a law bringing every species of wild game into the hunting season at one time and ending at one time, viz.: beginning October 15th and ending June 2d.

Resolved, That we favor a law authorizing the several courts of this Commonwealth to appoint suitable persons to act as wild game wardens in the several townships, the same as fish wardens are now appointed by the State, and that there may be not less than three appointed, nor more than nine in each township of the county, whose duties it shall be to see that the game laws are enforced.
