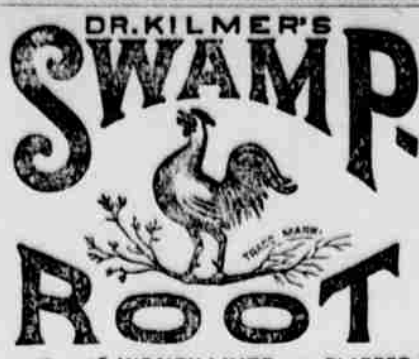

Food for Your Plants.

Give your plants all the sunshine possible, most of them revel in it, writes Eben E. Rexford in the March Ladies' Home Journal. It is food for them and quite as necessary as a rich soil. Ferns, some of the begonias, and a few other plants prefer to remain in the shade, but they like a good light, such as comes from diffused sunshine. Put your fuchsias where they will get the sunshine of the forenoon, and give your heliotropes and geraniums a southern exposure. Plants like the Bermuda lily, azaleas and oleanders should be kept out of strong sunlight if you care to have the flowers last well. Be sure to give them fresh air daily.
