ORDINANCE NO. 68.

AN ORDINANCE TAXING DOGS OWNED OR KEPT WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Town of Blooms burg, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same :

Section 1. All dogs owned or kept by any person within the town limits shall be taxed in the following man-

One dollar for the first dog, or spay ed bitch and two dollars for each and every dog or spayed bitch, above that number so owned or kept by any one person or by members of his family to be assessed and collected in like manner as taxes are assessed and recoverable by law for the use of the

Section 2. Every bitch owned by any person shall be taxed two dollars, and further shall not at any time be permitted to run at large within the limits of the town. In case any bitch is found running at large it shall be the duty of the constable to kill the same or have it killed as soon as practicable, for which service such constable shall receive a compensation of one dollar from the town for

every such animal so killed. Section 3. The word "dog" shall include every dog or pup of any and every age. The word "bitch" shall include every bitch of any and every

age excepting spayed bitches. Section 4. Ordinances Nos. 45 and 47 and all other ordinances or parts hereby repealed. Passed April 7, 1893. Attest: FRANCIS P. DRINKER,
