#### The Derivation of Calico.

The word calico has a queer origin. Many centuries ago the first monarch of the Province of Malabar gave to one of his chiefs, as a reward for distinguished services, his sword and all the land within the limits of which a cock crowing at a certain temple could be heard. From this circumstance the town which grew up in the center of this territory was called Calicoda, or the cock of crowing. Afterward it was called Calicut, and from this place the first cotton goods were imported into England, bearing the name of calico.—*Detroit Free Press.*
