COLUMBIA COUNTY FAIR.

Thirty-ninth annual exhibition of the Columbia County Agricultural Society to be held next week, October 10th to 14th, inclusive, will be the grandest exhibition in the history of the Society, and surpassed by none in the State. The Committee on Grounds have re-modelled nearly all the buildings, and provided for the increased attendance. In the building for horses eighteen additional stalls have been made, and a building with nearly two hundred stalls made for the cattle. Convenient pens are made for sheep and hogs. An addition of forty feet has been made to the large stables for trotting and running horses, thus giving a building forty feet wide and one hundred feet long, conveniently arranged with stalls.
