Registration of Physicians.

LICENSES MUST BE TAKEN OUT BY ALL PRACTITIONERS.

The state board of medical examiners of Pennsylvania calls attention to the act of assembly approved May, the fort with us. A. D. 1893, entitled an act to establish a medical council and three state boards of medical examiners, and to define the powers and duties of said medical counci's and state boards of medical examiners, to provide for examination and licensing of practitioners of medicine and surgery, etc. Section 14 of said act 18 as follows:

"From and after March 1, 1894, no person shall enter upon the practice of medicine or surgery in Pennsylvania unless he or she has complied with the provisions of this act, and shall exhibit to the prothonotary of the court of common pleas a license duly granted in Danvi le. Precautions have been taker to prevent its spread.
