These political revolutions are so highly indicative of the uncertainty of how the American political cat may jump that the betting fraternity are obliged to take the same risks as the politicians.

Populist Growth in Wisconsin. The Populist was the only one of the four parties that made any gain in Wisconsin. In this State the gain of the Populist party is estimated at 45,000, or about four times the vote it cast in 1892.

The Slingerly vote shows a gain of 32,963 on the Hancock vote of 297,966 last February, the Democrats polling 330,929 for the head of the ticket this year.

Postmaster Kiser's Resignation. The resignation of Elliot P. Kiser as postmaster in Hazleton has created no little surprise in political circles in Luzerne county.

The political complexion of the Legislature. There are 204 legislative districts in the State. In the next legislature, according to complete returns, the membership of the State senate will be made up of 7 Democrats and 43 Republicans.
