

TO BOYCOTT WANAMAKER.

At the general assembly of the Knights of Labor, statements reflecting on the course pursued by Ex-Postmaster General Wanamaker were made. His store employing about 3000 people, mostly girls, was ordered to be boycotted. They have undertaken a big job.

The Masons of Western Pennsylvania propose to raise \$800,000 to build and equip a Masonic university in Beaver, by asking every Mason in the country to subscribe ten dollars. It is expected that most Masons would send their sons to the university, while the children of dead Masons, who could not afford to pay, would be educated in it free of charge. Beaver is said to be the centre of the Masonic population of the United States, and the Masons of the place say they will give the proposed institution a site of eighty acres.

A Peculiar Election Bill.

According to the Harrisburg Star the Commissioners of Dauphin county had to wrestle with the following bill of expenses for holding an election in that county: One tin rule, 10 cents; two miles going for same, 12 cents; one dozen candles for booths, 20 cents; two miles traveling for same, 12 cents; one bottle of ink, 10 cents; two miles traveling for same, 12 cents; four miles carrying water, 24 cents; two miles for bringing mucilage, 12 cents; one half gallon coal oil, 5 cents; two miles traveling to bring same, 12 cents; one sheet iron and pipe, 35 cents; two miles for bringing same, 12 cents; total, \$1.76. The Commissioners paid the man only 40 cents of the amount claimed.
