Professor M. C. Ihlseng, head of the department of mines and mining at the Pennsylvania State College, is investigating what is supposed to be a very rich deposit of phosphate rock in Juniata county.

The East Pennsylvania Evangelical conference opened its fifty-seventh annual session in Ebenezer church last Thursday. ### Maple Sugar Production.

The production of maple sugar has decreased noticeably. According to the last census, twenty-four states made returns, but the total yield was only 33,000,000 pounds, against 36, 500,000 pounds ten years earlier. Vermont leads with something over 14,000,000 pounds; New York follows with 10,000,000 pounds annually. New Hampshire turns out 2,000,000 pounds per year. Pennsylvania, Ohio and Michigan, formerly important producers, show a rapid decrease in production, and the same is true of the states of Indiana, Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Wisconsin.




