At the session of the Odd Fellows grand lodge in Pittsburg, some changes were made in the conduct of the order that are of interest to the membership in Columbia county, as well as in all parts of the state. Hereafter an assessment of twenty-five cents a year will be levied on each member of the order for the support of the Odd Fellows orphanages-the amount to be divided in proportion to the number of inmates in each home. At present about one hundred and thirty orphars are being cared for in these homes, and the twenty-five cent assessments will produce an annual revenue of about \$26,000. The per capita tax paid by each lodge to the grand lodge has been ten cents each six months, but this has been changed, and the semiannual payment will be eleven cents in the future. A change was also ordered in the constitution of subordinate lodges, whereby funeral benefits will be raised by direct assessment on the members, or by a higher rate of dues-instead of taking funeral benefits from the general funds of the lodge, as is now the practice. The encampment branch of the order has always levied special assessments for funeral benefits.
