# DEMOCRATIC RULES.

ARTICLE I.

OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION.

Sec. 1. The annual county convention shall be held at Bloomsburg the second Tuesday of June, 11 o'clock in the fornoon and the primary election shall be held on the preced-ing Saturday at the places of holding the General Elections in the several election districts between the hours of 3 and 7 o'clock in the afternoon.

Sec. 2. The primary election shall be by ballot and shall be conducted by the Judge and two Inspecof the district and who shall be elected at the preceding Primary Election. Their duties shall be the same as defined in the general election laws.

The ballots shall not be numbered. The said officers shall be sworn to perform their duties faithfully and as said election.

They shall make a list of the voters and make out two duplicate statements showing the result of such elec-tion, the total number of votes cast and the names of the persons voted for, and the number of votes cast for each; one of which statements shall ments shall be either mailed by Re-gister Letter, or sent by Special Sec. 6 Messenger to the address of the County Chairman. The said election officers shall indorse upon the enveby register letter or of the delivery of may deem proper. the same to a special messenger, to-

the original ballots cast, in an envelope, which shall be securely sealed of the duplicate statement. and addressed to the chairman of the convention, and deliver the same to the newly elected judge of election.

The duties heretofore prescribed to be performed under this rule shall be performed by an election board of the watchers, heremafter provided for to be present at such election; where a vote is received after objection made by any watcher or member of election board said ballot shall be marked with the name of the individual voting it.

Sec. 3. No person shall be allowed to vote at any primary election who has voted against the democratic candidates at state or national elections within two years; or has opposed the Democratic ticket at the last preceding election; or has taken money or has agreed to take money or other thing of value, or any pecuniary advantage as a consideration for his vote at such primary election, or corrupted or attempted to corrupt any voter of the district with reference to the same, or has in any wise whatsoever violated the primary election

Sec. 4. The voter shall indicate upon his ballot the person for whom he wishes to vote to be placed in nomination for the respective offices by crossing off the names of all persons for whom he does not wish to vote, or write upon the printed ballot, as provided to be furnished under these rules, the name of the person for whom he desires to vote to be placed in nomination for any office.

Sec. 5. If a ballot is cast at the primary election which does not contain names of all the candidates for a particular office, it shall be the duty of the election officers to reject such part of the ticket from the Count.

Sec. 6. The tickets to be furnished for the primary elections, as provided for in the rules, shall contain the names of all the candidates, who shall have registered with the Chairman of the County Committee with blank spaces under each group to enable the voter to add the name of any person for whom he wishes to vote.

Sec. 7. Upon a tie vote for choice of primary election officers, the acting judge of the election shall determine the choice by lot.

# ARTICLE II.

OF THE CONVENTION.

Sec. 1. The County Convention shall be comprised of the newly elected judges of the primary election of the respective districts.

In case of the death, sickness or inability of the judge to attend upon the meeting of the County Convention, his duties as a Return Judge and as a member of the County Convention shall be performed by one of the newly elected inspectors for primary election, who shall present to the convention the proper evidence of his right as a member thereof.

Sec. 2. The convention shall be

called to order by the Chairman of Chairman of the Committee to give the County Committee, or in his absence by any member of the Commit-tee who shall forthwith proceed to

effect a temporary organization.

The Chairman of the convention shall appoint such clerks or tellers as may be necessary to facilitate the business of the convention.

Sec. 3. The Chairman of the County Committee shall have prepared a return statement, which sha'll have been compiled from the duplicate statements sent him from the several election districts, and present the same to the Chairman of the Convention. After the receipt of such return statement, or cause shown for tors of Election who shall be residents its not production, the election returns from the different districts shall be called for, opened, and the returns examined and compared with the return statement.

Sec. 4. The candidate who shall have received the highest number of votes, as shown by the approved reprovided by law, they shall determine all questions of the right to vote at In case of a tie vote, the nomination shall be determined by casting lots.

Where two persons are to be nominated for the same office the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be nominated.

Sec. 7. The voting in convention shall be open and any two members may require the yeas and nays on any

Sec. 8. Where candidates for delegates to the State Convention shall before separating, and in the presence have registered with the Chairman -and shall have been voted for at the Primary Election-those receiving the highest number of votes shall be named as the Delegates.

### OF ELIGIBILITY.

Sec. 1. If it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of a majority of the Convention, that any candidate before it for nomination to any promise of money or valuable thing to take effect in future, as an inducement to any voter to vote for him at the primary election, or shall have caused the same to be done in his behalf; or if any candidate shall induce or attempt to induce another person to announce his name and run as the candidate for nomination to the same office for which he is seeking the nomination, with intent thereby to withdraw votes from some third candidate for nomination for the same office, or it such candidate shall cause and procure the same to be done by another in his behalf, the name of such candidate as well as the name of the candidate so induced to be a candidate, shall be immediately struck from the list of candidates ; or if any such facts be ascertained after his nomination shall have been made, to the satisfaction of a majority of the members of the Standing Committee, the nomination shall be struck from the ticket and the vacancy supplied by a new nomination to be made by the members of the Standing Committee.

Any candidate offending against the provisions of this rule shall be ineligible to any nomination for a period of five years.

Sec. 2. No person shall be eligible to a nomination by the party who has opposed the democratic ticket at the next preceding election.

Sec. 3. Each and every candidate for nomination to any office desiring his name to be printed upon the tickets provided to be furnished under these rules, shall register his name, post office address and name of office for which he is candidate with the Chairman of the Standing Committee in a book kept for that purpose not less than thirty days before the Primary election, and pay to the chairman a registration fee as fixed by the executive committee.

# ARTICLE III.

OF THE COUNTY COMMITTEE.

Sec. 3. Special conventions may be called when necessary, by the standing committee, the proceedings of which shall be in conformity with the

Sec. 4. The standing committee, shall on the last Saturday of March, 1898, and annually thereafter elect from within or without their number, one person to act as Chairman, one person to act as Secretary, whose terms of office shall begin with the first Monday of April following, and shall continue for a period of one year, or until their respective successors

shall have been elected.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the Chairman and Committee to have prepared a poll book containing a list of the Democratic voters of the several districts in the county, and to furnish to the officers to conduct the primary election with a copy of such poll book.

The poll books shall be prepared at least ten days before the holding of the primary election, and be open to the inspection of Democratic voters.

Sec. 6. The election board shall check off the names of the persons voting at such primary election as the voters cast their ballots.

Sec. 7. The election board shall add to the list of voters as contained in the poll book; the names of all other qualified Democratic voters, voting at such election.

Sec. 8. The Chairman and Committee shall furnish the tickets for use at the primary election and the necessary blanks, including tally list, list of voters, certificates, duplicate state-ments copy of poll book containing the names of the Democratic voters of consisting of five persons, two of whom the respective districts and cause the shall be the chairman and secretary same to be delivered to the election of the county cammittee.

Sec. 10. The county chairman shall cause to be published in the Democratic newspapers of the county, a notice of the time of the holding of the primary election and of the time and place of the meeting of the county convention, and of the nominations for office to be made by the convention for thirty days prior to the time of the meeting of the convention.

Sec. 11. In case of the death, declination or removal of any candidate put in nomination by the convention before the election; or whenever any candidate shall have had his name stricken from the ticket, the vacancy shall be supplied by a new nomination of a candidate which shall be made by the standing committee called together for that purpose by public notice from among citizens eligible under these rules.

Sec. 12. Until primary election officers shall have been chosen, or in case of any vacancy upon any Election Board, the County Chairman and the member of the Committee in which the vacancy occurs, shall supply the vacancy by appointment.


If at the hour of the holding of the Primary Election, persons qualified to hold such election shall fail to appear, the vacancy shall be supplied as regulated by the General Election Laws.

# ASSESSMENTS.

Sec. 1. Nominees of the convention shall be subject to the payment of assessments to defray the expenses of the delegate election and convention; campaign, and election purposes; the prosecution of persons violating the election laws, and for any purpose not prohibited by general

Sec. 1. The county chairman shall appoint an executive committee
