

TAMMANY'S BIG STRIKE

Tries to Get at the L Railroad of Gould and Sage.

AFTER RICH CORPORATIONS

Croker Says Justice Shall be Done—The Principal Move is to Oust the Elevated Structure from New York's Battery Park Where It Has Stood for Twenty Years.

New York, Feb. 21.—There was an interesting rumor yesterday that the avowed purpose of Messrs. Gould and Sage to equip the Manhattan system with electric power had brought much of the trouble which has just manifested itself as coming from the direction of Tammany Hall.

There is but one thing in this matter that Tammany wants, and that is justice. Tammany was returned to power in this city because a majority of the citizens thought that the big corporations were not respecting the rights of the people.

If the Manhattan had the interest of the people at heart it would not have allowed a week to go by without fixing the accommodations at the stations.

Our policy is one at a time. After we have set everything in motion to see that the people get justice from the Manhattan, other street railways will receive attention from Tammany.

The Manhattan directors still have a few cards left, and while no positive information was obtainable, it was reported that the Tammany authorities may find themselves held up as the worst obstructions to the improvement of the elevated system.

In fact, it is possible that at the meeting of stockholders of the Manhattan on February 23, originally called for the purpose of ratifying the plan to change the motive power on the elevated system and to provide other improvements for the public, it may be voted to give up for the present all such plans.

The directors of the Manhattan Elevated Railroad were not prepared yesterday to make any open answer to the attack on the corporation by Tammany Hall.

The improvements demanded by the board of health along the route of the "L" roads will, it is said, have to be carried out by the company, and it is asserted that the municipal assembly will find other means of causing a money outlay by the Manhattan directors.

The Gould interests are confident on this point, and the rise in the stock 2 1/2 points yesterday in a few hours showed that the Tammany men who expected to realize large profits by a sudden fall in prices, will be badly hurt if they remain in the market.
