Are the Greatest Trials of the Whart Owners to Southern Seaboard Cities.

The next day he looks for them and they are gone, every one-gone into his good piles. The torredo worms eat away steadily until they cut the hard logs fairly through just below high-water mark.

In years past it was the custom in some of the seacoast cities of the south to build wharves of a cribbage of logs, packed in with concrete.
