Don't Rock the Baby.

Strange as it may seem, the timehonored custom of rocking babies to sleep is a bad one. It is injurious to the children themselves, and is a cause, eventually, of much unnecessary trouble to their guardians. Mothers should, therefore, see to it that from the very first that the little ones are brought up in the way they should go, and that the monthly nurse does not get them into bad habits by rocking them to sleep, either in her arms or in their cots. There is no doubt that rocking is the most expeditious way of inducing a baby to go to sleep; but if one once starts, a baby will not sleep without it, and at a later age is likely to suffer from insomnia. Rocking may save immedi ate trouble to a lazy nurse or mother by inducing sleep when a child does not require it, or when it ought to be taken up from its cot and have clean clothes put on, but it will never cause that sweet, gentle and perfect sleep which should be characteristic of a baby who has no artificial aids to induce slumber.
