

BUSINESS MEN'S BLAST

AGAINST MAT. QUAY'S MACHINE.

Pennsylvania League Comes Out Squarely in Opposition to Barnett and Adams.

The Business Men's Republican League, of Philadelphia, placed itself on record last Thursday as opposed to most of the Republican State ticket and in favor of the election of William T. Cressy, the Democratic candidate for State Treasurer.

The full text of the address is as follows: The unswerving effort of the Business Men's Republican League, since its organization in 1896, has been to improve the character of our State government by opposing within party lines the selection of improper candidates by the Republican party for State offices.

A LAST DESPERATE EFFORT. ANGELES ATTACKED. Filipinos Use Artillery, Killing One American and Wounding Seven. MANILA, Oct. 17.—The Filipinos made an attack upon Angeles at half past 2 yesterday morning. One American was killed, and seven were wounded.

Norway Wants Independence. CHRISTIANIA, Oct. 18.—In the morning yesterday the Leftists adopted an electoral programme declaring, first, that Norway's independence should be recognized by the appointment of a separate minister of foreign affairs and the establishment of a separate consular system; second, that arbitration and neutrality should be recognized and enforced, and third, that a system of insurance against incapacity to earn a livelihood should be applied to the whole Norwegian people.

POTTSVILLE, Pa., Oct. 18.—An explosion of mine gas took place shortly before noon yesterday in the Shenandoah City colliery. Twenty-two men were employed. Ten of them were set out within an hour, but the work of rescue was interrupted by the mine catching fire.

AMSTERDAM, Oct. 13.—A dispatch to the Handelsblad from Batavia, capital of the Netherlands Indies, Java, says that a violent earthquake has visited the south side of the island of Ceram, next to the largest of the Moluccas, between Booroo and Papua, completely destroying the town of Ahhei and killing, it is estimated, some 4,000 people, as well as injuring some 500 others. The dispatch says that details of the disaster have not yet been obtained.

Winnipeg, Man., Oct. 16.—Prairie fires have swept over the Dauphin district in northwestern Manitoba. Hundreds of settlers were surrounded by flames before they had time to realize the danger, and houses, grain, haystacks and fences, valued at many thousand dollars, went up in smoke.

Fort Monroe, Va., Oct. 17.—The cruiser Brooklyn left Hampton Roads at 4:45 yesterday afternoon bound for Manila through the Suez canal. The battleships Massachusetts and Indiana and the cruiser New York sailed for New York. The Texas returned to Fort Monroe and later proceeded to Lambert's point, where she is now taking on coal.

HAVANA, Oct. 17.—The taking of the census throughout the island has begun. The census office estimates that a day's enrollment will be approximately 13,000 names. The people received the enumerators well and gave all the desired information readily. No difficulty is expected in the cities.

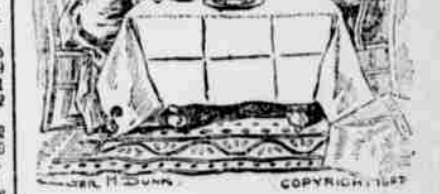
