BIELA'S COMET.

The Periodically Seen Body Was Observed This Year at Santingo, Chill.

The periodicity of Biela's comet was ascertained on its discovery, in February, 1826, by Biela; at Josephstadt, Bohemia, and, independently, by Gambart, at Marseilles, about ten days later. Both discoverers remarked the similarsty of elements to those of the comets af 1772, imperfectly observed by Montaigna at Limoges, and the first comet of 1806. Clausen's calculations showed that the period of revolution between 1772 and 1826 had been about 6 2-3 years, the comet having escaped observation at the intermediate returns, excepting that of 1806, when it was seen by Pons. Prof. Santim, of Padua, principally ocenpied himself with the investigation of the motions of this comet, as did more recently the late Prof. Hubbard, of Washington.

Biela's comet was observed at its reappearance in 1832, but was missed in 1839, from proximity to the sun. At its next return, in 1845-46, it was again found, and at this appearance a remarkable separation into two distinct nebulosities took place under the eyes of the astronomers. In 1852 both components were reobserved and were found to have considerably widened their distance from one another. At the return to perihelion in 1859 there was no possibility of observations from the unfavorable position in the heavons, but in 1866, according to calculation, its track seemed likely to favor observation, yet, in spite of long and careful seamh, the comet was not found, nor was anything seen of it until 1872.

DIFFICULT TEST.

One Man Subjected to Civil Service Examination Literally Interprets Instructions.

One of the hardest tests given applicants who go before the civil service commission boards of examiners is in the form of printed matter which is to be copied without a single change. It is said to be surprising to find how many intelligent people find it impossible to properly stand this test. They can frequently correct errors in language which they cannot copy verbatim, says the Washington Star.

There was lately an applicant who showed his aptitude for this work. He was given a printed page and told to copy it.

"Want it just like this?" he asked. "Without a change," the examiner replied.

The man labored. The printed matter was on a white sheet that was spotless, with the exception of a fly speck an one of its corners. The sheet the student had was minus a blemish in that particular spot, but when it was turned in there was a well-imitated fly speck. There was not a flaw in the work, and he received a rating of 100 on that portion of his examination, and to-day is one of the best and most trusted employes in the service of the commission, where he was detailed shortly after taking his examination.


