If they have rights in the estates of the farmers, such rights must be on record in the courts of the proper county. Whether there be or be not such to establish such rights and claims in the courts, before they will be allowed to prowl, with impunity, and unsolicited, over the lands of many farmers.

In our opinion, it is a question solely for the courts; for we do not believe that the Legislature have the power, to transfer the purchased, or inherited rights and privileges of the farmers, orginally granted by the Commonwealth, for the pleasure, sport, and benefit of other classes, among whom are included sportsmen, by any legislative enactment.

Private property and private rights, were regarded by our foretathers, so sacred, that the necessary safeguards were thrown around them by the constitution itself.
