The Montgomery County Commissioners have refunded a debt of \$77,000 with bonds at 31/2 per cent. interest, payable in twenty years, but with the right to liquidate them within ten. A bonus of over \$2,-000 was paid the county by the new bondholders. Heretofore the Montgomery taxpayers have paid 4 per cent, on their funded liability.

Dewey's announcement that he is a candidate for the Presidency did not create the sensation that was expected. The dominant sentiment is one of regret that he has been led into such a blunder. The platform on which he will stand will be announced soon, but what party he can get to adopt his platform and nominate him, does not yet appear.

Notes From the Pennsylvania Experiment Station.

Gravity or Aquatic Cream Separators

Information has been received at the Experiment Station that in many parts of the State where small dairies are kept, agents are selling the above named 'separators' with a claim that they are equal in efficiency to centrifugal separators. The claim made for these devises is that by diluting the milk in the separator with from one-third to onefourth of its bulk of water the viscosity is decreased and the fat globules consequently rise easily and completely to the surface.

This use of dilution is not new, it having been practiced at least ten years ago, and however plausible the claims made for it may appear, they are not confirmed by actual experiment.

In some trials made at the Cornell Experiment Station with three of these "separators," handled according to instructions sent with them, the following results were obtained on mixed herd milk compared with those obtained with a

deep setting 0.30 per cent. These results show that the aquatic separators do not approach the centrifugal separators in efficiency and further that they are more efficient than shallow plans or deep setting only in the case of "stripper" milk. The only conclusion to be drawn is that a fraud is being perpetrated upon the farmer when he is induced to buy a "separator" of this kiud with the expectation that he is getting something that will separate his cream as closely as a centrifugal separator,
