Your casualties were four officers and 32 men of the Munsters wounded and one missing; Captains MacPherson and Weakes and Lieutenant Conway severe and Lieutenant Boyd-Rochefort, Scotish rifles, slightly wounded; seven men of the Yorkshires wounded and one kill et and two wounded of the Imperia

Paget reports that but for the accurate practice of the Thirty-eighth Roy al artillery and the Fourth City Imperial atteries the casualties would have been

Baden-Powell reached Rustenburg during the evening of July 8 without opsosition. He found all quiet there and public confidence entirely satisfactory thanks to the prompt and bold grasp of the situation taken by Major Hanbury
