

CONDENSED DISPATCHES.

Notable Events of the Week Briefly and tersely told. More violent scenes in the Reichsrat at Vienna. A German missionary predicted a new Boxer revolt in China.

The czar signed the decree banishing Count Tolstol from Russia. Emperor William is not alarmed over reports of a plot against his life.

Burglars attempted to rob a bank at Wisconsin, Mo., but secured no booty. The river is still rising in Cincinnati but disastrous floods are no longer feared.

Work is to be begun soon on the new department of justice building at Washington. The Chinese are ready to guarantee safety of foreigners if troops are withdrawn.

Cuban customs receipts for January and February, 1901, show a decrease of \$229,081. George W. Marlor was appointed deputy assistant treasurer of the United States at New York.

Tuesday, April 23. British colliery owners have protested against the coal tax. Fifteen vessels are icebound in the harbor of Sidney, Cape Breton.

The president has appointed Admiral O'Neill to be chief of the ordinance bureau. Lord Kitchener has warned the Cape Colony rebels that they are in danger of death penalty.

At St. Mary's, W. Va., six deaths were caused by an explosion of gas in the C&M commercial hotel. The Prussian crop report just issued shows the worst condition since these reports have been kept.

The creditors of Prince Henry, husband of Queen Wilhelmina, threaten to negotiate his debts on the Amsterdam bourse. Monday, April 22.

Over 100 sporting men were arrested at a Jersey City cocking main. Natural gas in enormous quantities has been found in the Texas oil region.

J. Pierpont Morgan is reported to have paid \$150,000 for the celebrated Grinsborough painting. Dr. Browning of Philadelphia has put in a bill for \$190,000 for attendance on the late Senator Chris Magese.

By means of a breeches buoy the crew of the life saving station at Chudwick, N. J., rescued Captain McKeller and his crew of seven men from the stranded schooner Mola. Saturday, April 20.

The British house of commons adopted the war loan resolution by a vote of 186 to 117. Senator Frye, back from Santo Domingo, said that country was in a deplorable condition.

Indiana miners en route to Kentucky coalfields to inaugurate a strike were stopped by the sheriff. The Lowell (Mass.) Democratic club pledged itself to work for the nomination of Richard Olney for president in 1904.

Friday, April 19. The Michigan legislature has legalized ten round prizefights. The transport Rosecrans has reached San Francisco from Manila.

General John C. Gilmore has been placed on the retired list of the army. The chief commissary at Manila, General Woodruff, has cabled denying fraud reports.

Governor Odell has signed a bill providing for Sunday closing of butcher shops in New York state. The car shops and many freight cars of the New York Central railroad have been burned at East Rochester.

Thursday, April 18. Andries Wessels, peace envoy, reported shot by De Wet, was reported alive. Archbishop John J. Keane was invested with the pallium at Dubuque, Ia. Alexander Agassiz was elected president of the National Academy of Science.

The court of appeals decided that surety on the bond of a liquor tax certificate holder is liable for full amount of bond. The engagement of Major General S. B. M. Young to Miss Cornelia D. McLanahan of Washington was announced.

Alonzo J. Whitehouse, ex-mayor of DuBois, was sentenced in New York to two and a half years for passing a bad check. Monument to Perry in Japan.

WASHINGTON, April 24.—The navy department has received a letter from Rear Admiral Remey, in command of the Asiatic station, making known his purpose to be present at the ceremony attending the erection of a monument to Commodore Perry at Kurikama, Japan, on July 14. The ceremony has something of an international aspect and is indicative of the kindly sentiment existing between Japan and the United States.

President Schwab's Manifesto. PITTSBURGH, April 23.—Charles M. Schwab, president of the United States Steel corporation, has made an early start in spending a part of his large income, presumably following in the footsteps of his predecessor, Andrew Carnegie. Mr. Schwab has just authorized the erection of a large building for the Mount Aloysius academy at Cresson, Pa., which will cost in the neighborhood of \$30,000, but Mr. Schwab has set no limit to the cost of the building.

The Twenty-sixth Regiment Lands. SAN FRANCISCO, April 22.—The Twenty-sixth regiment, which arrived on the transport Garonne, landed yesterday and went into camp at the Presidio preparatory to being mustered out. The Garonne will be sent to Seattle, where she will be released by the government. The Garonne brought the unusual number of 64 stowaways.

Crown Claims the Gold. LONDON, April 24.—In connection with the recent discovery of gold at Leith, Scotland, by workmen who were preparing the foundation for a new hospital, it is announced that the crown authorities have notified the owners of the property of their intention to claim all the gold found.

Morgans Take \$50,000,000. LONDON, April 23.—Of the \$50,000,000 applied for prior to the issue of the British war loan prospectus it is reported that J. S. Morgan & Co. had taken \$10,000,000 for the firm and friends.

Ice Palace Collapses. SARANAC LAKE, N. Y., April 23.—The ice palace of the Pontiac club erected last January, collapsed yesterday. The ice is still good in the lakes.

Missionaries Killed.

WASHINGTON, April 23.—Figures received at the state department compiled by J. W. Stevenson, director of the Chinese inland mission, show that the total number of foreign missionaries killed in China during the recent disturbances, including the children, was 186. Of these 28 adults and 8 children were Americans.

American Concession in Egypt. LONDON, April 22.—The Egyptian government, according to a dispatch to The Daily Express from Cairo, has granted a concession to an American company to ply passenger boats between Khartoum and south Sudan.
