J. T. Rothrock, Forest Commissioner of Pennsylvania, has prepared a bill for the present Pennsylvania State Legislature to appropriate \$2,000 to the hydrographic division of the United States Geological Survey for two years, beginning June 1, 1901, for the purpose of gathering data and determining the volume and commercial value of the waters carried by the Delaware, Susquehanna and other important streams in the State. Under the provision of the bill the geological survey is to do the work and pay half the expenses of the investigation. If this bill becomes a law and the work is prosecuted, the result will undoubtedly be of great value to many interests in Pennsylvania, not only to those to whom the utilization of water power is necessary, but also to the cities and municipalities which draw their water supply from the streams of the State.
