Street Car Lines Tied Up. ALBANY, May 8.—The lines of the Union Traction company operated in this city, Watervliet and Rensselaer and those extending from this city to those cities and to Troy and Cohoes have been tied up since daybreak yesterday. One of the greatest railroad strikes that have taken place in this section of the state in years is on and threatens to extend. Up to midnight the lines of the company operated in Troy and Cohoes had not been affected, but a strike on those lines is expected. The employees of the company are organized in two unions of the Amalgamated Association of Street Railway Employees of America. The strike as ordered by the union is composed of the employees of the Albany, Rensselaer and Watervliet branches of the system. Half Holiday With Full Pay. SCHENECTADY, N. Y., May 8.—The General Electric company has made the announcement that it had decided to give its employees a half holiday, with full pay, beginning on Saturday, May 11. A petition asking for this boon has been in circulation for some time, and it is expected that the Schenectady Locomotive works will take similar action. China Will Need a Loan. PEKING, May 8.—China will request the powers to obtain for her a loan sufficient to pay the indemnity as soon as the amount thereof is made known. She will also ask for an extra 20,000,000 taels to be provided annually according to the proposition of the foreign ministers. No Treaty, Says Hay. WICKENBURG, A.
