Pennsylvania Railroad Reduced Rates to Minneapolis, Account National Educational Association's Annual Meeting.

On account of the National Educational Association's Annual Meeting at Minneapolis, Minn., July 7 to 11 the Pennsylvania Railroad Company will sell excursion tickets from all stations on its lines July 4 to 6, good to return not earlier than July 8, and not later than July 14, at rate of single fare for the round trip, plus \$2.00.

These tickets will be good for return passage only when executed by Joint Agent at Minneapolis and payment of 25 cents made for this service.

By depositing ticket with Joint Agent not earlier than July 8 nor later than July 14, and payment of 50 cents at time of deposit, an extension of return limit may be obtained to leave Minneapolis not later than September 1st.
