Washington, July 31, 1902. "The history of the first session of the fifty seventh Congress has been typical of the history of the republican and the democratic parties from time immemorial," said a gentleman at democratic headquarters today.

"Throughout the session," he continued, "the democrats have worked for principals, the republicans for votes. When the oleomargarine bill came up, the democrats, realizing that it was class legislation of the worst form, vigorously opposed it.

It has transpired that the President has requested all the members of his cabinet to take the stump this fall and speak in support of the party.

The general plan of the republican campaign, as outlined by chairman Babcock, will consist of oratorical effort rather than of the distribution of campaign literature.

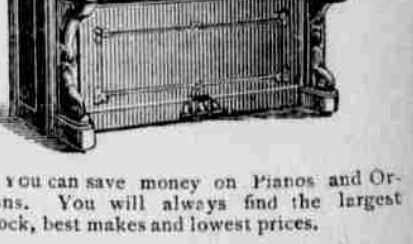
