### REBELLION FALLS FLAT.

Sultan of Morocco Has Taken the Wind Out of Pretender's Sails.

TANGIER, Morocco, Jan. 5 .- According to official news received here from Fez, the adroit move of the sultan in bringing his brother, Mulai-Mohammed, to the capital has attained the desired object of depriving the pretender to the throne of his prestige, and the latter has retired, discredited, to Taza. He has been deserted by a number of the local tribes, who dis ersed to make sure of their booty.

Buhamara, the pretender, having claimed the intention of enthroning Mulai-Mohammed, his rebellion has no longer any reason to continue, as the sultan has publicly reconciled himself with his brother and Mulai-Mohammed has made a solemn entry into Fez, acclaimed by the populace. The sultan has announced the appointment of Mulai-Mohammed as governor of the prov-Ince of Fez, thus disproving the rumors that Mulai-Mohammed aspired to the throne.

All immediate danger has disappeared. The routes from Fez to the coast are open. It is said the sultan is now preparing a large expedition with the intention of crushing the rebellion.

### CASTRO AGAIN WINS.

#### Rebels Defeated With a Loss of Fifty-seven Men.

CARACAS, Jan. 6 .- Fourteen bundred revolutionists under Generals Ramos and Penalosa attacked 800 government troops under the command of General Acosta Sunday morning at a point near Guatire.

After four hours' fighting the revolutionists abandoned the field and the town of Guatire. They had fifty seven men killed and many wound d. One of their guns was captured.

A prisoner captured by the government forces is authority for the statement that the revolutionists still lack ammunition.

About 1,500 rebels are reported to be marching on Caracas.

The activity and energy displayed by President Castro continue to surprise the foreign residents of this city. It is reported here that the leaders of the Matos movement are treating with the government.

All persons were taken to places of safety. No lives are reported lost, but much property has been ruined or lost.
