WAR ON THE SPARROWS. A Horticulturist Urges the Necessity of Killing them. 'Now is the time,' said a leading horticulturist, 'to wage war against those pests, the English sparrows. They cannot secure food and will come around the houses in search of something. Soak a little canary seed in a solution of strychnine and sweetened water and it will end the birds that partake of it. In England for years a reward has been paid for the destruction of those birds yet somebody introduced them into this country. They are a perfect nuisance and in addition drive away our native birds which are friends of the horticulturist and farmer. A universal crusade should be waged against them. One bit of caution may be necessary. Don't let the family cat dive on the birds you poison or you will have no cat.'
