TRENTON, N. J., April 22.—The New Jersey legislature met in special session yesterday and passed the Passaic pollution bill. This bill was passed during the regular session of the general assembly, but after the two houses had adjourned sine die it was discovered that the bill contained an error.

Landowners Like Wyndham's Bill. LONDON, April 22.—The Irish landowners' convention accepts the new Irish land bill as the largest and most liberal measure ever offered Ireland by any government and urges parliament to pass it, with reasonable amendments, as a great enabling act.

A Large Seal Catch. ST. JOHN'S, N. F., April 22.—The seal fishery this year will result in a total catch of at least 315,000 seals against 274,000 seals caught last year. The price this year is higher. The total value of the sealing product last year amounted to \$833,000. It will probably reach \$1,000,000 this year.

Senator Mallory Re-elected. TALLAHASSEE, Fla., April 22.—Stephen R. Mallory has been elected for another term in the United States senate by the two houses of the legislature in separate sessions, receiving all the votes in the senate and sixty-four in the house to one cast for J. M. Tombs of Apalachicola.

Palo Alto Typhoid Epidemic. PALO ALTO, Cal., April 22.—Twenty additional cases of typhoid fever have broken out here. Thirteen of these are reported from the city and seven on the university campus.

Five Killed in a Wreck. KANSAS CITY, April 22.—Five persons are dead as the result of the wreck near Everton, Mo., of a train on the Frisco system from Kansas City for Memphis and Birmingham. The wreck was caused by a defective rail.

Strong pressure is being brought to bear on Secretary of the Navy Moody to cause a general investigation into the bursting of the big gun on the Iowa and also into the disablement of the Maine as a result of the firing of her turret guns.

An examination of the Maine proves that she has been seriously injured and the cost of remedying the damage is variously estimated up to \$500,000. Not only have the supports of her turrets been injured but the emplacements of her six inch guns have been found to be weak and her boilers have suffered serious injury.

The Postoffice investigation still continues and there is every reason to believe that ample ground has been discovered to warrant the removal of several officials, but, for some unknown reason, presumably political pressure, the Postmaster General has refrained from taking the necessary steps.
