### Guarding Against Smallpox-

The officials of the Reading Railway have taken steps to prevent persons afflicted with smallpox from entering the stations and passenger cars of the company. Trainmen and station agents are instructed to be vigilant at all times, while on duty, that they may discover any and all persons on the trains or about the stations with eruptions on their faces that cause suspicions that the afflicted ones are suffering with smallpox. The experience of the company on this devision of the road recently has caused the officials to issue the order cautioning the subordinates to be watchful
