Rural Carriers Are Happy Over New Rulings.

Henceforth the rural mail carrier is to have more holidays and he is rejoicing greatly thereat.

Order No. 5—Ordered, That hereafter service on all rural free delivery routes be suspended on New Year's day (January 1), Washington's birthday (February 22), Memorial or Decoration day (May 30), Independence day (July 4), first Monday in September, known as Labor day, and such day as the president may set apart as Thanksgiving day in each calendar year.

The firm operated in Bloomsburg for some time. The office here was closed two months ago owing, so the local representatives said, to lack of business.
