| Want to Restrain Aroanum. <br> Attorney General Parker of Massachusetts has been asked to retition the Supreme Court for the njunction restraining the Supreme Souncil of the Royal Arcanum from niorcing the assessment rates dopted at the convention at Atantic City, last April, and ratified it Put-In-Bay, Ohio, in August. <br> Those whoare acting in the mater include residents of New York, Jetroit, Paterson.
