Want to Restrain Arcanum. Attorney General Parker of Massachusetts has been asked to petition the Supreme Court for the injunction restraining the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum from moving the assessment rates adopted at the convention at Atlantic City, last April, and ratified at Put-In-Bay, Ohio, in August. Those who are acting in the matter include residents of New York, Detroit, Paterson, N. J., and Providence, R. I., as well as several Massachusetts members. Their request was transmitted to the Attorney General by Insurance Commissioner Cutting. Attorney General Parker said last week: "The matter is before the Attorney General's Department, but no decision has been reached. The papers are being given careful consideration, and it cannot be stated at this time how long it will take. The work is being done as expeditiously as possible because of the importance of the case." The question was brought before the Massachusetts officials because the Royal Arcanum was organized in this state in 1877, a charter having been granted on November 5th of that year. The petitioning members contend that the action of the Supreme Council in adopting the new rates

was unreasonable, unnecessary, inequitable, unjust and illegal, and for these reasons, inoperative and void. They further submit that never have they assented to change in the by-laws adopted at Atlantic City, and that the passage of these laws was beyond the powers of the Supreme Council and for this reason not binding. 100,000 Cars Have Been Ordered By Railroads. About 100,000 freight and passenger cars have been ordered from car works all over the United States by the railroads of the country to be delivered some time during the coming year. Of this number 35,000 have been or will be ordered in the near future by the Pennsylvania Railroad. This is the largest single order by any one railroad that has ever been made at any time by any railroad in the world. The next to the highest order by the Pennsylvania Railroad is that of the New York Central Railway, which will place an order for 25,000 freight cars of various descriptions before the first of the year. Other companies have placed orders for as high as 500 cars and other smaller companies have ordered various kinds of freight cars anywhere from 50 to 500, all to be delivered next year. To do this all of the car works of the country will be rushed from now until the latter part of 1906 and maybe far into 1907. The Pennsylvania Railroad will rely to a great extent on its own car works and a part of the order of 35,000 will go to these works, a large number of which are on the lines west of Pittsburg. The shops at Altoona have received orders for cars and will continue doing so for some time to come. The building of these cars will probably mean the hiring of hundreds of car builders in the shops throughout the country and will mean steady work for years.

THE POOR MINE MULE. He is Attacked With a Strange Disease in Schuylkill County. Some of the collieries in Schuylkill and Northumberland are idle this week because of a strange disease rendering them unfit for work. Just what the nature of the disease is has not been made known, but it seems to have spread throughout almost the entire stables. In order to properly treat the animals the collieries were closed down. This is the first time since the early 'seventies' that a mine had to close down because of a disease among mules. At that time the Canadian epizootic spread all over this country, reaching the mules in the depths of the mines and all of the collieries had to lie idle until the disease abated the time of illness lasting ten days or more.
