100.000 Cars Rave Been Ordered By Railroads

About 100,000 freight and passenger cars have been ordered from car works all over the United States by the railroads of the country to be delivered some time during the coming year.

Of this number 35,000 have been of a press agent.

Or will be ordered in the near future

The next to the highest order by the Pennsylvania Railroad is that message that we may listen to His of the New York Central Railway, music. which will place an order for 25, 000 freight cars of various descriptions before the first of the year. an anthem. Other companies have placed orders for as high as 500 cars and other smaller companies have or dered various kinds of freight cars anywhere from 50 to 500, all to be

delivered next year.

To do this all of the car works of the country will be rushed from now until the latter part of 1906 and maybe far into 1907. Pennsylvania Railroad will rely to a great extent on its own car works and a part of the order of 35,000 will go to these works, a large number of which are on the lines west of Pittsburg. The shops at Al-toona have received orders for cars and will continue doing so for some time to come.

The building of these cars will probably mean the hiring of hundreds of car builders in the shops throughout the country and will mean steady work for years.
