PRIZES FOR CORN.

Are Offered Pennsylvania Corn Growers By The State Live Stock Association.

Those who have good corn should not fail to select ten ears to show at the third annual corn show to be held by the Pennsylvania Live Stock Breeders' Association at Harrisburg, January 25th-29th next. Eight silver cups, ranging in value from \$25 to \$50, will be offered in the various classes and forty-five cash prizes in addition. A \$50 cup is offered for the best show of one hundred ears made by any subordinate Grange in the state. Save your best corn for this show! The annual meeting of the State Board of Agriculture, the Penn'a Dairy Union and the Penn'a Live Stock Breeders' Association, will be held on these dates, and the best talent in the country will be on hand to give instructions and demonstrations. Exhibits of dairy products for which liberal prizes are offered, will be a feature, and the Penn'a Experiment Station and the State Live Stock Sanitary Board will also make exhibits worth seeing. For corn entry blanks, prize lists, etc., address Secretary E. S. Bayard, East End, Pittsburg, Pa. There are no entrance fees. All Pennsylvania corn growers are invited to participate in the show, which is free in every particular.
