.The battle of Sacramento.

The dispatches published a few days ago, rom Col. Doniphan, relative to the battle of Sacramento, contain the following extracts. The unbounded success of the main divisions of our army, under Generals Scott and Taylor, have wholly absorbed the attention of the people-hence the little regard paid to the glurious achievements of those other heroes who have been so daringly operating in another section of the enemy's country. But after the din of battle has ceased, and peace and quict once more taken their place, the gallant nehievements of the army in New Mexico and California will receive from the impartial pen of the honest bistorian, the just due of praise, to which their gallant deeds fully entitle them:

The Mexican forces, on the contrary, mustered 4,220 rank and file, and had with them 10 pieces of artillery, varying from 4 to 10pounders, and 7 1-pound oulverins. Mexicans lost about 300 killed, 500 wounded, all their artillery baggage, stores, ammunition; and the rest of the troops were "scattered to the four winds of heaven."
