Other instructions carrying the treaty into effect, will be given upon the ratification of the treaty.

### ARRIVAL OF THE WASHINGTON.

New York, Jan. 8.—7 P. M. The steamer Washington, Capt. Johnson, left Bremen on the morning of the 16th ult., and Southampton on the 20th at 3 P. M., making nineteen days passage, she brings on board passengers and 800 packages of merchandise from Bremen and 800 packages of valuable merchandise from Havre, shipped at Southampton, and a fair quantity of freight on English account.

Funds up. London money market very easy. Consols 92 1/2. The French funds improved 5/8. Paris 70 1/2. The London Corn had advanced 1/2. Flour was very dull and slow sale—Indian Corn heavy.

Flour.—Advices from Havre of the 16th say: Business continues to improve daily since the election of Bonaparte. The price of staple articles were on the advance. Our ordinary advices from the French capital are to the evening of the 18th. Paris tranquil. There was a continuation and an increase of confidence perceptible among the money and commercial classes of the metropolis and of the Departments. Large quantities of purchases of French funds have been made, which were still on the rise.

The new President was to be proclaimed at the Hotel de Ville on the 21st of December, and the new cabinet afterwards. Mr. Guizot, however, was to be at the head of the new government and M. La Martiniere was spoken of, as likely to be put in nomination as Vice President of the Republic. Fully constituted, the Ministry will probably consist of M. De Sain, Foreign Affairs—M. De Montigny, Interior—M. Passy, Finance—M. Leon Frucher, Public Works—Gen. Rullieres or Gen. Oudinot, War—Some changes would probably take place, and a variety of reports was in circulation.

Latest advices state M. Dixie, late President of the National Assembly had been appointed Minister of Commerce. Marshal Bugeaud was to be put in command of the Army of the Alps. Gen. Oudinot had declined the Embassy to St. Petersburg. M. Emile Girardin did not appear in the contemplated cabinet. Gen. Cavaignac was to receive the elevation of a Marshal of France. Accused 5,500,000 votes—Cavaignac 1,500,000—Ledra 1,000,000—Raspail and La Martiniere 500,000 in all.

HUNGARY.—The Hungarians were burning down their towns and villages and destroying all means of communication, in order to cut off the invading Austrian army, but they were not successful.

ITALY.—The trial of Mr. Gavin Duffy was proceeding.

GERMANY.—From Frankfurt, we hear of a disposition on the part of the German Assembly, to re-open negotiations with Austria.

FRANCE.—The accumulation of immense quantities of bullion in the bank of England, £15,000,000, the general appearance of affairs is good—a general improvement in manufactures, &c. The English funds have risen nearly one per cent. Foreign mail reached London on the 19th, with advices from Bombay on Nov. 16. The British were determined to absorb the Punjab, and the army looked forward to immense spoils of jewels, gold, &c. A decisive battle was expected in December. The forces of the Pope still remain at Gades, surrounded by diplomatics. Not less than 20 Cardinals were assembled to give their advice to his Holiness. He had determined to take refuge in France. A provincial Government was about to be established at Rome. The Government was thought the great Powers would interfere to trouble the Pope's authority. The affairs of Italy become every day more involved and menacing. King Charles Albert had been compelled to yield to the Liberals.
