In addition to the mate, cook and sailor, there were on board the schooner, the second mate, who as confined to his berth by sickness, the Captain's nephew, a lad of 18 years, and a servant girl belonging to one of the passengers.

In addition to the cargo, there was considerable specie on board, belonging to the passengers. The fate of the second mate, captain's nephew and servant girl will be uknown until further accounts are received.

On or about the 25th of December, the whale ship Hope, Capt. Christy, Mr. B. says, touched at the Island; and was entreated by the passengers of the Rosa to supdy them with provisions and a boat by which they might reach the coast but for some cause they were refused. The unfortunate passengers remained on the Island, saffering for want of provisions and necessaries, until the 14th of February, when they were released by a small vessel of 15 tons burthen, and arrived at Guayaquil of this place, aged 5 years 10 months and 17 days. on the 15th of March entirely destitute of dothing and in a lamentable condition.
